Mr. Wolf was first appointed to his chairmanship of the Pennsylvania Commission for the World's Fair by former Governor George H. Earle. When Governor Arthur H. James was inducted, he quickly reappointed Mr. Wolf. Amid a storm of unfounded criticism, Mr. Wolf and his committee aides have gone on with their work and when Pittsburghers and residents of the state visit the big Fair in New York, they will be made well proud of the exhibition carrying the name "Pennsylvania."
