## HOW TO SHIP HIDES

Ship hides by freight in bags or in bundles, well tied or sacked. Attach a tag to every bag or bundle. See that hides are well salted before shipping or they will spoil in transit. Send sheep skins and deer skins by freight also. Ginseng and Golden Seal by Parcel Post or Express. Always get a bill of lading and send it to us by mail after you make shipment.
