Dear Mr. Ragsdale:

This is to advise you that instead of being mustered into the military service at Camp Lee, Virginia, to which camp I was sent by my local Draft Board on August 29, 1918 for general military duty, upon examination at said camp on Friday, September 6, 1918, I was found physically disqualified and given a "DISCHARGE FROM DRAFT", copy of which is enclosed herewith, and sent home the following day. The discharge was due to two reasons;- 1st: My right arm was found too weak to carry a gun, and 2nd: my heart being jumpy, or beating too fast at times.

I would therefore thank you to take up the matter of my reinstatement into the service with the proper authorities at the Bureau in order that I may again enter upon duty.

While this certificate discharges the person named herein from his present
obligation to serve in the Army, it does not operate as a permanent bar to his
subsequent entrance into the military service. Under Section 5 of the Act of
May 18, 1917, all registered persons remain subject to the draft unless exempted
or excused as in that Act provided. Therefore, this discharge does not excuse
the holder from obedience to the process of Exemption Boards.

men rejected on account of physical unfitness, dependency, etc. It will not be
used in cases of men who have been accepted for military service and are sub-
sequently discharged.
