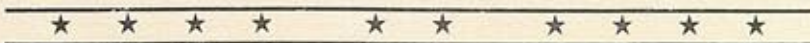

Ensign WILLIAM IRA ADELMAN
 Killed in action December 10, 1944, at Leyte, age 30; executive officer on Navy PT boat; overseas 3 months, New Guinea, Philippines; took part in naval battle of Philippines October 1944, in which Jap fleet suffered crippling damage; Purple Heart, Asiatic Theatre of War Ribbon; husband of Meryl Ruben Adelman; son of Abram Adelman; brother-in-law of T/Sgt. Jerrold R. Ruben, killed in action over Italy, April 10, 1945.

Sgt. JACK ARLUCK
 Killed in action over Berlin, Germany, age 20; in service 14 months; overseas 2 months, South America, Ireland, England; waist gunner on B-24; Purple Heart; son of Mr. and Mrs. Norman Arluck.

Cpl. ALVIN ARONSON
 Died February 2, 1944, in India, age 19; in service 2 years, overseas 1 year; crew engineer with ATC; volunteered to go to China; son of Mr. and Mrs. Abe Aronson; graduate of Peabody High School.

1st Lt. MELVIN S. BARRETT
 Killed in action March 5, 1945, in Italy, age 29; in service 30 months, overseas 6 weeks; combat engineer with 10th Mountain Division; Silver Star, Purple Heart, Unit Commendation from General Hays; husband of Cpl. Felicia Barrett, USMCWR; son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Finkelhor.

1st Lt. NATHAN BASKIND
 Killed in action June 23, 1944, in France, age 28; served in Tank Destroyer Corps in Africa, Italy, England and France; son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Baskind.

Pfc. ALFRED BEHR
 Killed in action December 19, 1944, in Belgium, age 22; in service 35 months, overseas 3 months; served with Armored Infantry in France and Belgium; Combat Infantry Badge, Purple Heart; son of Mr. and Mrs. Herman Behr.

Pvt. ALAN DAVID BERNSTEIN
 Killed in action June 6, 1945, at Okinawa, age 19; in service 9 months, overseas 3 months, with United States Marine Corps; son of Mr. and Mrs. I. A. Bernstein.

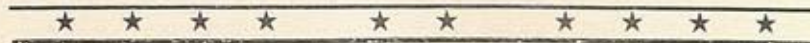
Cpl. SAMUEL M. BERNSTEIN
 Died November 29, 1943, in Ireland, age 26; in service 32 months, overseas 5 months, Ireland and England, with Army Ordnance Motor Transport; son of William Bernstein.

Lt. (j.g.) HERBERT S. BONN
 Killed in action April 6, 1943, at Hawaii, age 28; patrol pilot commander in United States Navy Air Force; in service 30 months, overseas 18 months, Coral Sea, Midway, Australia, New Caledonia, Pearl Harbor; son of Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin H. Bonn.

Pfc. CARL M. BRENNER
 Killed in action September 22, 1944, at Moncel, France, age 19; in service 16 months, overseas 4 months in England, France, as mortar gunner in Infantry; Purple Heart; son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry L. Brenner.
