Dear daughter, why haven't I received a letter from you for over two months? I can't understand it. Are you God forbid, so weak or something that you can't write? Has the farm done you any good? I heard that Alfie shows

to hear that they are getting along so much better. Lena asks why we don't sell out & come back. We can't even think of selling now - not now & not before. Times have been bad ever since we returned to Palestine. Please don't worry about us. We are getting along as well as anyone else in Palestine. So there is nothing to worry about. Please tell Lena the same. As soon as times brighten up a bit & we feel able to sell out,

great improvement. I hope it is true. Did the doctor think he should have remained there a little longer? How is his school work now? Write me how Sam is. I received a letter from Lena last week and also one from Frances. I was very glad to hear from them. We can't expect to receive mail as often as before so we are always glad to receive letters. Lena wrote how nicely the children got along on the farm and I was happy



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nothing would suit us better. Anyway there is nothing to worry about. Do you get any mail from Jack? I haven't received a letter for some time but I hope it will come soon.
