Dear Mother,

How are you. I am
feeling great. Even still better
than that. The war is over.
Has been for a few days.
Was out a few days and I
could not write. Am certainly
glad. Really I cannot express
myself. So you were
worried about Dave. I nearly
went mad. I couldn't do
a thing. I really did not know
what to do. Now that he
got exempted I am satisfied.
All well that ends well.
Nobody got hurt so a little

worry did not hurt me.
Now that the war is over I
know he is safe. Will
write you more when they
sign the peace terms. I
Something real interesting.
You ought to see things
around here. Talk about
men been happy. We
have regular fourth of
July celebrations every night.
The sky lite up with all
kind of fireworks. Really
I cant express in words
the feeling of the men.
When the censorship of
letters is over I will write
you something that will
even surprise you.

When we get home is
something I cant tell. I hope
it is real soon. But I will
get home when the division
sails. They surely did get
