IN MEMORY OF MOLLIE LYON

Mollie Millstone Lyon was born in Russia, April 22, 1899, emigrated to the United States at the age of eight and died at the age of 92 on April 29, 1991.

She started her working career as a Group Leader at the Irene Kaufmann Settlement, and later became its Executive Secretary. In 1930, she was the first woman Talk Show Hostess on KQV Radio.

She was a member of Junior Hadassah, held many chairmanships and offices in the Pittsburgh Chapter and served as its President from 1943 to 1946. While on the Hadassah National Board she was responsible for putting the Pittsburgh Chapter on the Group Plan. As a member of the Chapter Board for over 50 years, she served as President of the newly formed Ein Karem Group when it was chartered in 1975. She was part of a Five-Generation Hadassah Life Membership Family.
