## Pitt Memorial Room Dedicated To Dr. Alexander Lowy

The long and distinguished teaching career of a University of Pittsburgh faculty member was memorialized with the dedication Monday, May 25, of a conference room in George Hubbard Clapp Hall.

The room, located on the first floor of the building which houses departments of the Division of Natural Sciences, will be known as the Lowy Room and is the gift of the wife and children of Dr. Alexander Lowy, professor of chemistry at the University from 1918 until his death in 1941.

Attractive and functional in design, the Lowy Room will be used for small seminar classes, student, faculty, and departmental meetings, oral examinations for candidates for graduate degrees and other official activities of the Di-vision of Natural Sciences. It is equipped with a large and small conference table and chairs,

shall conference table and chairs, a lounge section, screen and pro-jector for showing slides and films, a glass chalk board, and book shelves for important pub-lications in the field of natural sciences.

A portrait of Dr. Lowy presented to the University by his family has been hung in the oak paneled room. Bound volumes of all his publications will be placed in the bookcases. To the left of the door is a plaque recognizing the gift of the room.

In 1918, Alexander Lowy, Co-lumbia Ph.D., came to the de-partment of Chemistry at Pitt as assistant professor (professor, 1921). He was an excellent student, an ardent research worker, and an inspiring teacher of organic chemistry and remained con-

stantly active and a profound influence until his death in December, 1941. During his service to ber, 1941. During his service to the University, he published sev-enty-five books and journal ar-ticles, many of them with his as-sociates and students. His text-book of organic chemistry (co-author Benjamin F. Harrow) has gone through numerous editions and has had over a hundred adop-tions in American colleges and uptions in American colleges and universities. Dr. Lowy was interna-tionally recognized for his know-ledge of dyestuffs and intermediates, electro-organic chemistry

and disabling chemicals. The dedication ceremony was attended by Mrs. Lowy and her two daughters and their husbands, Dr. and Mrs. Joseph Hersh and Mr. and Mrs. Robert Fleishman, and Dr. Alexander Lowy, Jr. who presented the room to Chancel-lor Edward H. Litchfield.




