The trial of all Crimes, except in cases of Impeachment, shall be by Jury; and such trial shall be held in the State where the said Crimes shall have been committed; but when not committed within any state, the Trial shall be at such Place or Places as the Congress shall make.

In all criminal prosecutions the accused hath a right to be heard by himself and his counsel, to demand the nature and cause of the accusation against him, to meet the witness face to face, to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and, in prosecutions by indictment or information, a speedy public trial by an impartial jury of the vicinage; he cannot be compelled to give evidence against himself, nor can he be deprived of his life, liberty or property, unless by the judgment of his peers of the law of the land.

Art 5 - Sec 27

The parties, by agreement filed, may in any civil case dispense with trial by jury, & submit the decision of such case to the court having jurisdiction thereof, & such court shall hear and determine the same; & the judgment thereon shall be subject to writ of error as in other cases.
