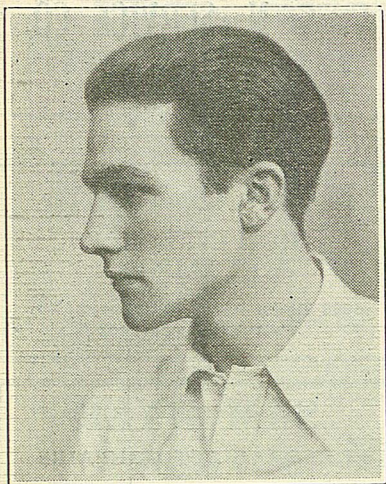


Beth Shalom Children in Musical Production

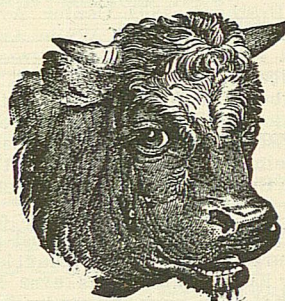
