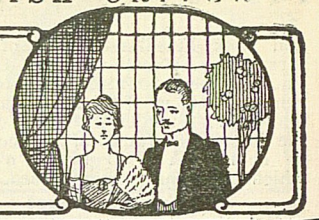

The Harvey Strassburger Circus

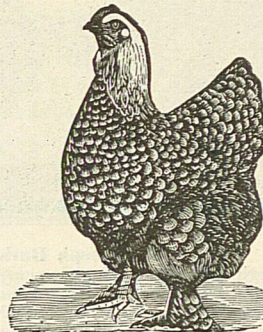
