Renowned Sociologist

Renowned Sociologist Appears on "Y" Series Considered one of the best informed authorities in the sociological field, Mary van Kleeck, director of Indus-trial Studies for the Russell Sage Foundation since August, 1919, will have the distinction of being the only woman lecturer to appear in the cur-rent series arranged by the Y. M. and W. H. A. Lectures Committee. That Mary van Kleeck merits this distinc-tion is an undisputable fact. She speaks on Tuesday evening, February 23, in the auditorium on "Backgrounds of Industrial Relations in the Coal Industry." Industry."

Industry." Society improvement has been the basis for the life-work of Miss van Kleeck. She received her A.B. degree from Smith College in 1904, dedicat-ing herself from then on to social work. As the head of the Investiga-tion of Women in Industry Committee from 1905 to 1909, Miss van Kleeck startled the economic and political world with facts and figures concern-ing women in shops, mills, and fac-tories which she later compiled in her book, "Women in Industry."
