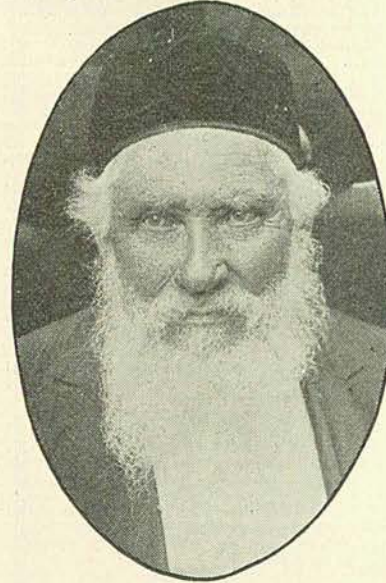
Mrs. Rebecca Danziger.
