G. To ppeak of this work being done elsewhere is impossible for the following reasons:

1. In most homes, washing machines are not available

2. In many homes, women are in war work, and would be forced to take time off to do this essential cleaning

3. Home laundries and linen houses are not equipped for this particular industrial laundry

4. Experience in other cities has shown much loss of time for women war workers stopping to do this type of cleaning of clothing

5. Such cleaning destroys home washers, and puts a drain on available parts, creating additional pressure where the need is to reduce the consumers' demand.

Summation:

Each day, regulations concerning existing and supplies of working clothes, as well as those being manufactured, are becoming more stringent. There are restrictions on pockets, double seats, cuffs, triple seams, etc. Our company uses special processes which make it possible for existing stocks to last considerably longer than is the case under any other method of washing.

Also, day by day, existing stocks of wiping materials are being diminished, due in the main to a cutting off of foreign imports, as well as the fact clothes are being worn longer and not being converted into wipers as readily as previously; plus the additional burden being placed by war industries. Again, by proper methods as well as salvage itself, we are contributing an essential service to insure an abundance of wipers for essential war industries.

II

In the second instance, this appeal for deferment is based on the fact that the appelant will become a father on or about May 1, 1943. This fact is established by affadavit of Doctor, attached. An examination of the records will show that appelant was married on July 26, 1940, several months before the Selective Service Law was enacted. Furthermore, by agreement, appelant and wife set a two year limit of marriage before having children, and in this case no attempt is made to evade selection, or to postpone selection when imminent by having children. Under these circumstances, appelant submits that at least a 3B classification is reasonable and justified by the facts in the present case.

III

In support of classification into Class 2A, appelant submits attached statements of President of company. Having established the necessity of war work being done by this Company, appelant endeavors to show his position as being of a key nature that would adequately justify your Board in placing appelant in Class 2A.
