Dr. Goldenson Delivers Sermon at Dedication of Temple Israel, New Castle

PAYS TRIBUTE TO RABBI'S MEMORY

Founded in memory of Rabbi J. Leonard Levy, Temple Israel, of New Castle, was formally dedicated last Friday evening, November 4th, when Rabbi S. H. Goldenson, of Pittsburgh delivered the dedicatory service, with an accompanying program of dedicatory exercises.

Scholarly Speaker

Rabbi Goldenson, Ph.D., who delivered the dedicatory address, spoke feelingly of Rabbi Levy, in whose memory the temple was founded.

"I rejoice with this congregation in the completion of this temple," said Rabbi Goldenson. He prophesied that the congregation would go forward in Judaism with great strides and urged them to stand fast in the faith of their fathers.

Charles H. Joseph, editor of The Criterion, also spoke, and he likewise congratulated the congregation upon its forward step in providing such a splendid temple for the worship of God. He paid a special tribute to the late Rabbi J. Leonard Levy and told of his life work in the ministry of the Jewish race.

Opened With Music

The program of Friday evening opened with an organ prelude by the temple organist, Mrs. Emanuel Roman, followed by an anthem, "Seu Sheorim", by the temple choir, directed by the temple chorister, Abe Levine.

Jacob F. Perelman, one of the pioneers in the movement for the temple, then deposited the Torah in the Ark. The congregation and choir then joined in Sh'ma Yisroel.

The kindling of the Perpetual Light was performed by Mrs. J. Leonard Levy, widow of the deceased rabbi.

Following Mr. Joseph's address, prayer was offered by Rabbi Glazer, of Pittsburgh. Mrs. W. L. Cosel then read a translation of the Old Testament. Miss Rosella Cahen rendered a vocal solo, "The Lord Is My Light".

Presents Temple Key

The key to the temple was presented to the congregation by Bernard Kline, who was chairman of the Building Committee. In presenting the key he expressed his gratitude that the temple was now complete and thanked the congregation for having given him the opportunity to be of some service in the erection of it.

For the congregation, Marcus Feuchtwanger, president of the congregation, responded. No other single person has been so much responsible for the erection of Temple Israel as Mr. Feuchtwanger, and his work as well as that of his wife has been the guiding spirit of the congregation since its organization.

Abe Levine, secretary, then read the history of the congregation.

First of Series

The dedicatory services on Friday night were the first of a series of three meetings. Last Saturday morning, at 10:30, a religious services was held in the temple, with Rabbi Benjamin Glazer, of Pittsburgh, delivering the sermon. The Sabbath service was read by Rabbi J. B. Menkes and the Torah reading given by Rabbi Goldenson. Miss Florence Weinberg, the soloist of the morning, sang "Hold Thou My Hand".

Sunday afternoon a "Felicitation Service" was held at 2:30, with a large list of speakers participating, and on Sunday evening, at 6:30, a banquet was held in the dining rooms of the temple.

With the dedication of Temple Israel, New Castle has one more beautiful religious structure. Located at the corner stands as a monument to the faith and of Highland and Moody Avenues, jr hope of the members of the congregation.
