A HOLIDAY MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

As I write this pre-High Holy Day message, I suddenly experience a strong ambivalent reaction to my future assignment as Rabbi in your Congregation for the coming High Holy Days. I am pherced by a feeling of strangeness and I think to myself: "The Jewish Community of Latrobe, Pennsylvania seems so far away, so unfamiliar. What are they like?" Yet, beyond this emotion of unfamiliarity and estrangement, I feel a sense of attachment, closeness and warmth. I am immediately impressed with the well-known express ion: "CHAVERIM KOL YISRAEL- All Israel is united".

No matter how distant we, the people of Israel, are from each other and no matter how different we may be in position, economic or social status, we are all brothers under the Fathership of God. It is precisely this sense of Jewish unity that is crucial to the continuance of Jewish living. It is a singleness of purpose-commitment to Torah and Israel-which must be shared by all Jews and must strike a responsive chord in us all as we draw near to the holiest period of the Jewish calendar - the High Holy Days.

During these solemn days of prayer and spiritual introspection we yearn for the realization of that religious ideal expressed in the liturgy of both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippurs "Let them all unite in one fellowship to ac Thy Will with fullness of heart."

Let us, with genuine sincerity and effort, overlook petty differences and disagreements and join together accepting God's Will with a full and glad heart, contributing thereby to the ultimate redemption of the Jewish people and the salvation of all mankind.

May it be thy will, O Lord our God and God of our fathers, to renew unto us the coming year in sweetness and in happiness. Amen.

I AM THE SYNAGOGUE

I am the heart of Jewry, I have sheltered you for more than two thousand, five hundred years. Through all these cruel ages, swept by wrath of fire and sword, I nursed you with Word of God, healed your wounds with the balm of faith, steadied your minds and hearts with the vision of the Eternal.

When your fathers wept by the waters of Bablon, I came into the world, summoned by their need. In Persia, Greece and in Rome, in the face of the howling crusaders and in the clutches of the Black Inquisition, in the pogroms of Poland, and in the concentration camps of the Nazis, I have been, and by my presence brought the living waters of the Eternal to the parched lips of your fathers.

I am old and I am young. I am older than the memories of the historians; and as young as the youngest child.

I bring you peace by teaching you duty. I sanctify your lives with the holy seasons. I preserve your heritage. I make the faith of the father the faith of the children. Behold, a good doctrine do I give unto you; forsake it not.
