

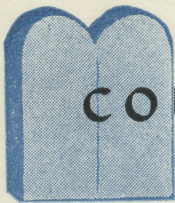

In answer to your inquiry, I am sorry to say I did not succeed in getting any one for you.


The transportation problem is the main difficulty. It involves three hours travel daily. If the young man has no car, then it might take even longer.
