Under new business a resolution was presented by Wm. Friedman in behalf of the Sunday School and Confirmation Class and at the motion Mr. Kaplan seconded by Mr. Axelrad, the resolution was ordered, spread upon the minutes and is herewith attached and made a part of this record.

Comments by Mr. Kaplan following the resolution by Mr. Friedman expressed the true sentiment of the feeling of the children. Mr. Friedman did splendidly.
