#### CONVENTION CENTER AWARDS FOOD SERVICE CONTRACT

The five-year contract providing food service management for the new David L. Lawrence Convention Center has been awarded to Arasery, according to R. Douglas Long, director of the Center.

"Of the seven execllent proposals we received, Araserv far exceeded our expectations on both their culinary expertise and their financial commitment to quality food service in the Convention Center," said Long.

Arasery currently manages the food service at Pittsburgh's Three Rivers Stadium and Civic Arena.

Araserv's award winning chef, Bernard Urban, will head up the transition

team of chefs for the banquet, catering and concession service in the new Cen-

Urban's culinary achievements include the Grade Prize at the National Restaurant Association's Culinary Art Show and the Grand Prize at the Pan American Culinary Art Show in Miami.

In 1900, Joseph and Hannah Klein opened a modest little delicatessen-restaurant on Penn Avenue. As the cook, Hannah Klein meticulously prepared delicacies from their native Hungary and Joseph, as the restaurant's only waiter, served his wife's tempting dishes in such a gracious, efficient manner that everyone who visited the restaurant felt like an honored family guest. It was this personal attention that helped make Klein's Restaurant the rendezvous for Pittsburghers and their guests.

The greatest tribute to the founders is the fact that even in the fourth generation of the Klein family, the personal attention and cordial hospitality continues unb'emished

No one today has any idea just how many restaurants were opened in Pittsburgh in 1900 -but we do know that Joseph and Hannah D. Klein started what was to become, and is one of Pittsburgh's oldest and best known eating places.

Klein's has never remained static, not even in one location over the years, but whatever it was, whether Sea Food-Klein's all-time specialty-or just "good food" in general the attraction was strong enough to cause their loyal patrons to follow them from the original site at 809 Fifth Avenue. First to the Moose Temple. then to Smithfield Street, then to the Seventh Avenue Hotel and finally in October 1935 to their present Fourth Avenue location, where they opened again-under the supervision of Virginia Klein Holzman and Sidney and Sam Klein.

Since opening at their present location. Klein's has been remodeled and redecorated several times in keeping with a policy of progressive restaurant operation, good taste in decor and superlative food. Introducing new specialties to their menu frequently, Klein's has adhered to the original emphasis on sea food and features the famous Lobster Thermador, Garlic Puffs, Florida Stone Crab Claws, Crab meat au Gratin, Lobster stuffed with Crab Meat, Caesar Salad, and other delectible dishes.

Klein's continues to celebrate its Eightieth Anniversary period through December.

Any "landmark" restaurant has its list of celebrities who have dined there at one time or another. Klein's is boastful of the number of times it has repeatedly been host to the famous men and women who have come to Pittsburgh over the past eighty years. Among the notables are Leopold Stokowski, Sam Jaffe. Helen Hayes, Rosalind Russell, Dorothy Gish, George Jessel, Al Jolson. Eddie Cantor, Boris Karloff.

## KDKA-TV AIRS 27th ANNUAL CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL SPECIAL

For the 27th consecutive year, KDKA-TV will host the popular television special to help earn money for the many children in Children's Hospital, who need support so very much. In fact, most of the magic during this season is transmitted through the hearts of all the beautiful young people who exist through the efforts of Children's Hospital.

The work for Children's Hospital began at Christmastime in 1951, four years before KDKA-TV took on the well-known call letters. Every Sunday night, the station, then WDTV, broadcast the Wilkins Amateur Hour. The show was hosted by Al Noble and owned by the Wilkins Jewelry Company, which is now David Weis.

Back then, there was no such thing as videotape so the entire special was broadcast live. A camera was set up in the hospital, and the telephone company provided a cable which carried the signal from there to the station. Today fortunately, technological breakthroughs allow the station to use convenient minicams instead of the 500-pound cameras of 1951 and microwave

#### THIS WEEK IN PITTSBURGH

### GREATER PGH. INT'L AIRPORT SHOWS STEADY GROWTH

Passenger figures released recently by the Allegheny County Department of Aviation show that air travel at Greater Pittsburgh International Airport is continuing its current upward trend despite the downward spiral in passenger totals recorded at many airports across the United States. Third quarter tabulations for 1980 show that \$8,711,765\$ passengers either boarded or departed aircraft at the Airport. Compared to 1979's record third quarter \$8,367,114\$ passenger count, the growth experienced this year reflects a 4.1 percent increase.

The opposite effect is occuring in overall domestic and international scheduled airline traffic. According to figures released by the Air Transport Association of America, airline passenger traffic was down 3.9 percent through the first nine months of 1980.

Third quarter aircraft operations show a slight gain of 2.4 percent over last year, operations totaled 265,647 as compared with 259,322 a year ago. Commercial operations contributed a 5.5 percent increase, while general aviation and military activity decreased 7.9 and 11.9 percent respectively.

In 1953, just two years after the first television station hit Pittsburgh, Bill Burns joined WDTV's newsteam. He began hosting the Children's Hospital special in the initial year at the station and has been doing the honors ever since. The Wilkins Amateur Hour continued the annual Christmas special until 1957, two years after the station became KDKA-TV. That year, KDKA and the Press Old Newsboys joined forces to carry on the fund drive, and they have worked together for all but three years since then.

Hosting the Christmas special will be: Patrice King Brown and John Wade in Studio A with Bill Burns; Dave Durian and Liz Miles at Monroe-ville Mall; Patty Burns and Ray Tanne-hill at Century III Mall; John Sanders and Roy Fox at the telephone bands in the Hilton Hotel; and Jack Bogut at KDKA's traffic circle.

MUSEUM OF ART ANNOUNCES NEW ACQUISITION

The Museum of Art, Carnegie Institute has acquired a major painting by the American Abstract Expressionist master, Philip Guston (1913-1980). According to John R. Lane, Director of the Museum of Art, Carnegie Institute, the acquisition, "Plain," a large oil on canvas 69 x 93 inches. was painted in 1979 and is one of the artist's last large works. The picture is included in the large Guston retrospective exhibition organized by the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art and will be seen at the Museum of Contemporary Art. Chicago, The Denver Art Museum, and the Whitney Museum of American Art.

Guston taught at Washington University, St. Louis, and Boston University; he was honored by the Guggenheim Foundation, the American Academy in Rome, the College Art Association, and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and was awarded first prize in the exhibition, "Painting in the United States," at Carnege Institute in 1945; besides the Museum of Art, Carneige Institute, he is represented in the collections of many other great American museums including The Museum of Modern Art. (Continued from Page 5) port's increasing stratigic role in the worldwide network of large hub airports is evidenced by these figures, adds Aviation Director, David L. Donahoe. "Increased business activity and awareness of Pittsburgh's great industrial capacity and potential has kept our market strong despite the recession."

The Director added that the pending final-step measure of Presidential approval for non-stop flights to London next year and a strong complement of carriers serving Greater Pitt, assures a steady growth in passengers next year and in the years ahead. 
