To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court:

In compliance with the requirements of an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations," approved the 29th day of April, A. D., 1874, and the several supplements thereto, the undersigned, all of whom are citizens of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together for the purpose hereinafter specified, and desiring that they may be incorporated, and that a charter may be issued to them and their associates and successors according to law, do hereby certify:

FIRST: The name of the proposed corporation is CONGREGATION B'NAI ISRAEL, of Glassport, Pennsylvania.

SECOND: The purpose for which the corporation is formed is for the support of public worship, according to the faith, doctrine, discipline and the usages of the Hebrew faith or creed.

THIRD: The place where the business of the said proposed corporation is to be transacted is in the Borough of Glassport, County of Allegheny and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

FOURTH: The corporation shall have perpetual succession by its corporate name.

SEVENTH: This corporation has no capital stock. Fees for membership and annual dues of members shall be assessed as the corporation by its by-laws shall determine, which fees and

dues, as well as money derived from all other sources, shall be applied to promoting the purposes for which the corporation is formed. New members may be admitted as provided for in the by-laws.

EIGHTH: The yearly income of said corporation, other than that derived from real estate, shall not exceed the sum of twenty-thousand (\$20,000.00), Dollars.
