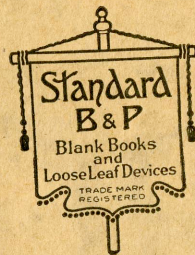

Jan. 12, 1921

A society has this day been formed among the Jewish women of Doraville with the following membership.

The purpose of this society is to be social at present until further decision. The officers elected were Mrs. H Greenberger Pres. Mrs. J. Lewis Sec. & Treas.

The name chosen was Hebrew Ladies Society. The meeting adjourned to meet again at the home of Mrs J Lasky on Jan 25.

Jan. 25, 1921

When Hebrew Ladies Society met at the home of Mrs. Lasky. The minutes of preceding minutes were read & approved.

Mrs Jaskin made a motion that each member pay one dollar (1.00) as installation fees. The motion was seconded & carried.

A motion to buy a book for minutes was made, seconded & carried. The meeting adjourned until Feb. 8, to meet at the home of Mrs. Lewis.

Feb. 8, 1921

At the meeting of the Hebrew Ladies Society a motion was made by Mrs. Paskey, seconded by Mrs. Leyton & carried that Jews should join the Council of Jewish Women.

A motion was made by Mrs. Leyton, seconded & passed unanimously that we should join the B'nei Cholim Society.

Mrs. Lewin & Mrs. Leyton were chosen as a committee to get a Sunday School Teacher.

Feb. 22, 1921

The business part of the Religious school was discussed and a motion made, seconded & carried to elect Mrs. Paskey as chairwoman of same.

March 8, 1921

Sunday school matters were discussed some of the members being of the opinion that \$5 per child was much for those who had several children to send Mrs. Greenberger suggested that we being members of the C. of J. W. they should pay for Religious school teacher. It was finally decided that not less than 25¢ or more than 50¢ was to be paid by each member for religious school.

It was suggested by Mrs. Greenberger that Treas. make a report of finances at each meeting. It was suggested that we have Purim Party for children. The matter will be further discussed at next meeting which will be assumed be held at Mrs. Paskey on Mar 22.

March 22, 1921

Meeting at Mrs. Paskey's house only 8 members present. President absent due to illness. Mrs. Leyton Presided. Pro Sem.

Matter of car checks for teachers taken into consideration and it was decided to tax each member 35¢ extra to pay for same.

It was also decided to have Purim treat next Sun. May 27. The next meeting to be held at Mrs. Posensweig.

April 7, 1921

Meeting at the home of Mrs. Posensweig. The payment for religious school for children discussed. Mrs. Paskey made a motion to have this paid from treasury, the amount to be divided among all families residing their children. The amount of \$100 to be paid by each family to be paid either in full or by installment.

The society is considering giving an entertainment for both men & women having the children recite also some outside speakers. Meeting adjourned to meet next at home of Mrs. Stoller.

May 3, 1921

Not many ladies on acct of rain. Very little business was discussed. It was decided to ask Miss Schofield to come at next Wed. & organize Council of Jewish Women.

May 17, 1921

Meeting at home of Mrs. Weiss. Not many ladies present. No business transacted. Next meeting to be held at home of Mrs. Supler.

May 31, 1921.

Meeting called to order at the home of Mrs. Snyder at 9:20.

A letter from the national president was read by Sec. Levin, concerning the organization of the Goraspolis Division of the Council, also a letter from the Sec. Mrs. Wm. Layb offering the council's best wishes for the prosperity of the Council. Also a letter from President & Executive Sec., all three expressed the hope for future success, enlargement & achievement for the new division council.

President Layb read card from Mrs. Lothrop requesting the presence of Goraspolis Div. at their regular meeting on Thurs.

Mr. Moskowitz, Supt. of Religious Schools read program for closing exercises also gave talk on work accomplished by religious schools.

Date for Picnic was put June 19.

Motion made by Mrs. Snyder seconded by Mrs. Grumberger & carried that money collected from children should be sent to New York immigrants.

A committee consisting of the Mistresses Lepton, Levin & Raskin was appointed to ask for donations from each family in the shape of a gift to be raffled at the picnic.

It was decided meeting should be held at home of Mrs. H. Grumberger on June 14.
Meeting adjourned at 10:30.

June 14, 1921.

Meeting called to order at 8:40 at the home of Mrs. Grumberger. All members were present with the exception of Mrs. Lasky. Minutes of preceding meeting read & approved.

Picnic plans were discussed with the result that Pres. Lepton was given full power to buy refreshments to be sold at picnic grounds.

Mr. W. W. Traub was appointed a committee of one to arrange a sports program & to buy prizes for game.

A committee consisting of the Mistresses Lepton, Raskin, Grumberger, & Mrs. W. W. Traub was appointed to go to picnic grounds, early and arrange things.

It was decided that the next meeting be held at the home of Mrs. Lahan July 09.
Meeting adjourned at 10:30.

July 19, 1921.

Meeting called to order at 8:15 at the home of Mrs. Lahan by Pres. Lepton. Minutes read & approved. Cor. Sec. makes a report on letters received and written.

Treasurer makes a report.

Mrs. Grumberger was the speaker of the occasion. She outlines program for conducting meeting.

I. Recording Secretary's duties.

- a. Reading & writing of minutes
- b. Keeping an accurate account of all bills.

II. Corresponding Sec. duties.

- a. The reading of all correspondence received & waiting all letters notices etc.

III Treasurer's Duties

- (a) Treasurers must be bonded.
- (b) A written report on money received and paid out.
- (c) A verbal report also.
- (d) Presentation of bills.
- (e) Putting all bills to the vote.

IV President's Duties

- (a) To call meetings to order & conduct same

V Vice-president's Duties

- (a) Taking the place of Pres when said Pres. is absent

Mrs. Schechter accepted as new member.

A board of directors was elected & beside the officers who are directors ex-officio Mrs. Funn & Mrs. Schechter were elected as directors.

Motion made, sec & carried that a check for \$15.00 & an accompanying letter of thanks be sent to the local Y M C A for their kindness.

No money was to be used for gifts taken from treasury, all gifts must be bought with subscription money.

It was suggested that pres. sec. outline program for conducting all meetings.

A beautiful vocal solo was sung by Miss Cahad.

It was decided that next meeting be held at home of Mrs. Oscar Funn.

Meeting adjourned at 10:30.

Aug. 26, 1921.

Meeting called to order at 8:30 at home of Mrs. Oscar Funn, by the President. Minutes read & approved. Sec. Secretary makes report. Treasurers makes a report.

A motion was made, duly seconded and carried that 3 books be bought to keep all records of the Div. Council.

The speaker of the evening was Mr. Finkelman of the Hebrew Institute.

The answer from letter sent to Y M C A was read. No remarks. Also a letter from Mrs. Funn was read & the \$1.00 donation was made note of.

It was decided that next meeting be held at home of Mrs. S. Lewis.

Meeting adjourned at 10:30.

Sept. 1921.

Meeting called to order at 8:30 at the home of Mrs. Lewis by Pres. Lyon. No reports made by officers as this was not a business meeting.

Mr. Freycoston made a splendid appeal for the maintenance of the Polygons school. He expressed the hope that the work done by religious school shall be kept & prosper.

Meeting was adjourned at 10 o'clock.

Next meetings to be held at home of Mrs. Lyon.

October 20th, 1921.

Meeting called to order by the President, Mrs. Leyton, and minutes of previous meeting read by newly elected secretary, Mrs. Lasky, Miss Greenberger having resigned. Two new members were admitted to society, Mrs. H. Greenblatt and Mrs. G. Heinen.

The sum of money collected by children bringing pennies each week last season was donated to Immigration Society, in New York, and Mrs. Snyder was detailed to attend to this.

The matter of bonding the Treasurer was brought up by the President, and after due discussion, motion was made by Mrs. Lavin, seconded and carried, that this be done in the sum of \$200.00.

It was also decided that one or two members be present at the Religious School classes each week to attend to all details pertaining to same. Mrs. Cahen was first on list to take charge. However, this work will be more or less voluntary on the part of the members.

It was suggested that two members visit Mrs. Goodman each week, as she is a chronic invalid. Mrs. Cahen and Mrs. Lasky first two appointed.

The pipes at the "Y" being out of repair, motion was made by Mrs. Gaskin and seconded by Mrs. Lavin that the Society have same repaired. Motion was carried.

Treasurer did not read her report at this meeting, due probably to oversight. Mrs. Leyton read letter from Pittsburg Council requesting each member to contribute ten cents towards expenses of State Conference to be held in Pittsburg October 26th and 27th. She also read program of various events of conference and urged members to attend as many or all of these events as possible.

Fifteen cents was also collected from each member present to pay for book presented to Miss Miriam Schogfield in appreciation of good work done towards getting local Council and Religious School organized.

We had a large and pleasant attendance at this meeting, and it is hoped that the members will attend meetings as regularly as possible, as we believe this will tend to promote friendship and good fellowship among members.

After collection of dues meeting was adjourned, to take place next at the home of Mrs. Moses.

November 22nd, 1921

Society convened at the home of Mrs. Moses, and was called to order by the President, Mrs. Leyton, and minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Some of the members, having objected to the expense incurred in the maintenance of the religious classes, various plans and remedies were suggested and discussed in an endeavor to reduce expenses as much as possible.

It was finally decided to eliminate the paid Superintendents and have one of the members do this work gratis. Mrs. Benj. Schacter volunteered to undertake this responsibility, to be supplemented by Mrs. Cohen's son, Mr. Leonard Cohen.

It was also decided as a further means of reducing expenses, that instead of each child bringing a quarter every week, they bring as much as parents wish to give; this motion was made by Mrs. Schacter and seconded by Mrs. Raskin. Parents were also urged to send children as regularly as possible.

Ways and means for raising funds for Treasury were also discussed, and in this connection Mrs. Cohen kindly offered to entertain with a musical at her home, and a limited number of tickets sold at a certain stipulated sum. However, this matter was not definitely decided.

Treasurer read her report, stating no money spent last month, and having on hand sum of \$70.00 and some change in Treasury.

There being no further old business to discuss, Mrs. Leyton read report she made at State Conference regarding activities of Social Council, laying special emphasis on Religious School classes.

Acknowledgment, with thanks, of sum sent to Immigration Society last month was received and read to Society.

Motion made by Mrs. Schacter that a standing committee of three be appointed to take charge of all social matters in the future, all tentative plans of committee to be first placed before members to be passed upon before being finally executed. Mrs. Cohen, Mrs. Fisher and Mrs. Schacter were nominated and appointed.

In recent Red Cross drive Mrs. Schacter turned in sum of \$52.00 up to time of this meeting, with more to come in.

Percolator donated by Mrs. Moses was auctioned by members and bought by Mrs. Cohen for \$2.50. Due no further business: dues collected and meeting adjourned to take place next at home of Mrs. Lasby.

At home of Mrs. Tasky.

Meeting was opened with reading of Psalm by Mrs. Seyton.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Treasurer read report giving various expenditures during month past, and stated that expense incurred in connection with giving Chanuka play by children, amounted to

\$ Mrs. Scheeter reported number of Kings seals sold as 1125; also turned in \$11.00 in addition to amount previously reported.

An appeal was also made that children bring toys, or price of a toy, to be sent to children of Palestine.

It was also suggested that money brought by children for the charity fund, be contributed to some worthy charity of Pittsburg.

Motion made by Mrs. Levin, and seconded by Mrs. Snyder, that trustees be appointed to take charge of various charity donations. Also that a memorial fund be created.

Mrs. Seyton read letter stating that next conference will be held in Philadelphia.

Definitely decided to hold musical at Mrs. Cahen's residence on January 8th, 1922, each member to be held responsible for third tickets, price per ticket to be 50 cts. Number of tickets limited to sixty.

Plans were discussed regarding holding of a motion picture benefit in the near future. Mrs. Levin was detailed to obtain a picture for this occasion, she to act in conjunction with the regular social committee, she to be on this committee regularly.

On motion of Mrs. Levin a rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Scheeter for her work in conducting the Chanuka play.

There being no further business, dues were collected in the amount of \$18.50, and meeting adjourned to take place next a home of Mrs. Cassin.
