JEWISH MERCHANT, WIFE AND DAUGHTER FOUND BURIED

London, June 21 (J. T. A.)—A tremendous sensation has been caused by the discovery by the police of the bodies of Herr Andrew Lachman, his wife and daughter, buried in the garden of their country villa just outside Bucharest, the Vienna correspondent of the "Northern Whig," of Belfast, reports.

Lachman was a very wealthy merchant with business connections in England and America. His wife was a very beautiful woman, and his daughter had many—admirers. The family are supposed to be the victims of an anti-Semitic crime.
