Refugee Rabbi to Occupy Tarentum Pulpit

A refugee from war-torn Europe is the new Rabbi of Ohev Scholom Congregation of Tarentum.

The successor to Rabbi J. Deckter, who resigned recently, is Rabbi Joseph Babad, Ph. D., who with his family, consisting of Mrs. Babad and two small daughters. Ada, 4, and Rachel, 2, arrived in New York City aboard a Dutch freighter, five months ago. Rabbi Babad and his family were residing in Clagenfurt, Austria, when the country capitulated to Germany

the country capitulated to Germany in 1938. He held the post of District Rabbi in the province of Carinthia. Shortly afterward the family moved to Vienna.

The family left the former Austria, now a part of the Greater German Reich, about one year ago and es-tablished a home in Amsterdam, Holland, while awaiting permission to sail for the United States.

Rabbi Babad and his family arrived in Tarentum last Thursday.
Born in Poland, Rabbi Babad was

educated in Austria and was gradu-ated from the University of Vienna. Keenly interested in world history, Rabbi Babad is also a student of lan-guages, having studied and being able to speak more than a half score of them. In addition to the Yiddish, he can speak Greek, Hebrew, Arabic, French, German, Dutch, English, Polish, Russian and other Slavonic languages besides having some knowl-

edge of Italian and Spanish. He is also a close student of Latin.

Rabbi and Mrs. Babad both speak English fluently and the little girls have also become quite familiar with the language since their arrival in New York five months ago.

Within a few days after his arrival in New York City he enrolled and took a course of Interdenominational Studies at Columbia University.

Rabbi Babad will take over his duties with the local congregation the first of next month.
