God grant that in the years ahead our Congregation will continue to grow (Continued on Page 4)





CHANUKAH

The problem of "to be or not to be a Jew" is not confined to our age. There were always those who rejected their Jewish identity by embracing assimilationism. Perhaps this is more our strength than our weakness. Through this process we rid ourselves of the irresolute, the weak, and those fleeced of their reason for existence.

Our fear should be for those unstable ones, who being neither here no there. have all but denied their Jewishness. These brand us as a vacillating people. straddling a fence of uncertainty before our neighbors. They are non-committal between yes and no to Judaism

Assimilation was the great issue in the days of Judah the Maccabee (165 B.C.E.) Numerous Jews embraced Greek culture and chose happily to forego their Jewish identity. Their clan was swallowed up forever. History condemned them to oblivion. Those, however, who remained faithful, fought fiercely the battle that history immortalized as the first struggle for religious freedom.

Chanukah stands for victory against the wilful annihilation and denial of the Jewish self. Chanukah, in our time practically coincides with a major non-Jewish holiday. This points up the problem of assimilation today. We become aware of fellow Jews who reject their own heritage in favor of another. Thus Chanukah decries the Jew who would forego his identity and annihilate his Jewish self

It is History's ironic trick that Chanukah, past and present, should emphasize the fate of the assimilationist. For this festival commemorates a drama in ancient Israel that resulted in victory with posterity for the strong of faith, and disintegration with oblivion for the weak assimilationist.

We the Jews of Beaver Valley ally ourselves with the strong of faith and posterity.
