### JEW IN INDIA.

Speaking of the Jews in India, the Hebrew Standard says: "The mystery of the continued existence of the Beni-Israel of India is as great as ever. It is marvelous to find these brethren of the house of Israel preserving their religious and racial identity among the vast multitudes belonging to alien ethnic faiths. These Indian Jews survive in an atmosphere which is altogether moved by caste, while they themselves regard caste as unthinkable for themselves. Like the Parsees, the following of Zoroaster, their numbers are scanty; their economic importance is considerable."

### AUSTRIAN GOVERNMENT QUESTIONED.

Vienna, Oct. 28.—A Jewish Deputy in the lower House offered an interpellation today as to whether the Government was prepared to instruct the Foreign Office to make urgent representations to the Russian Government calling its attention to the grave dangers threatening the Jews in Russia, and requesting it to take prompt measures to avert them.
