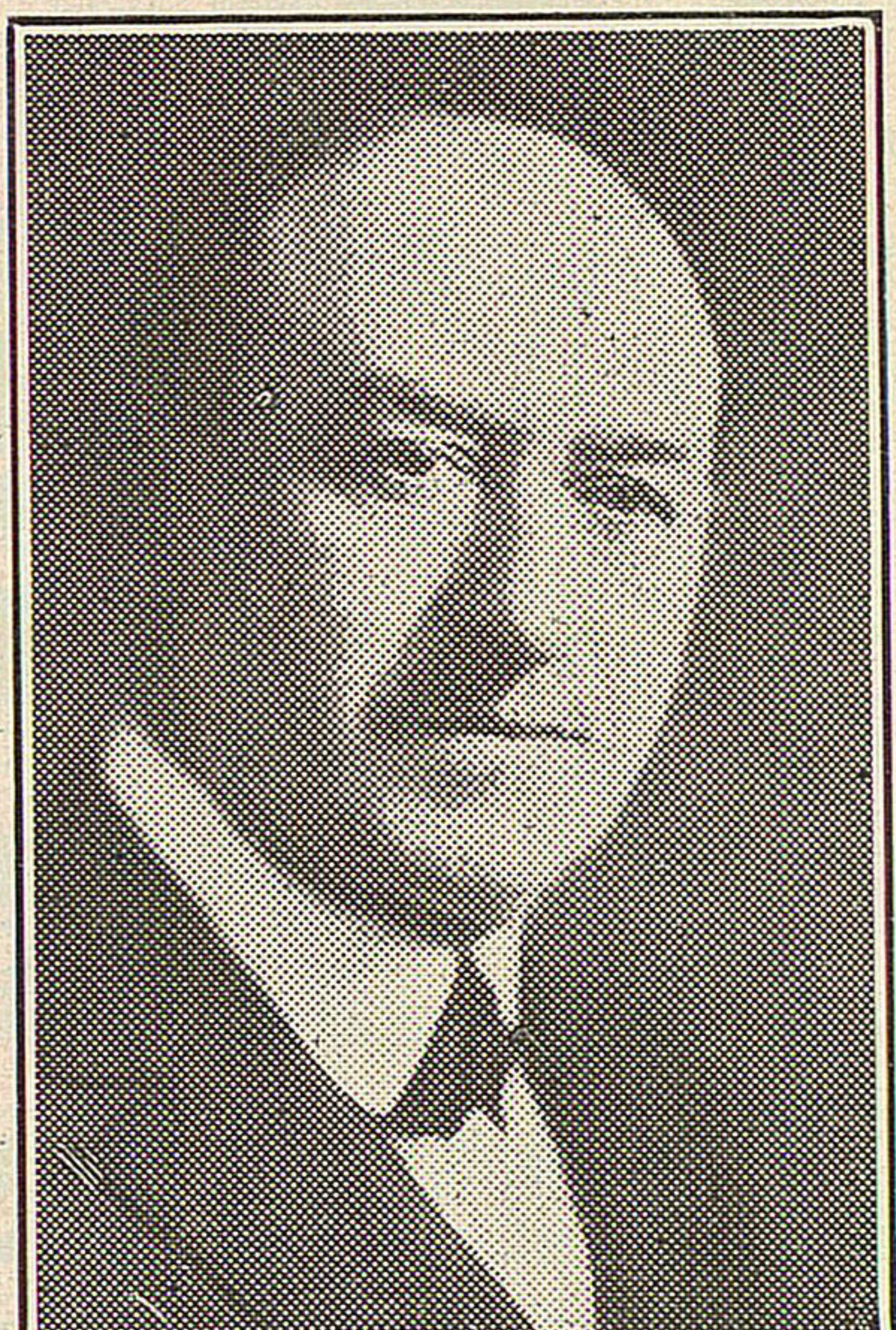

Nathaniel Spear, age 79, died on Thursday, June 19, in his home.

Mr. Spear devoted much of his time to interests outside the field of business. He was fond of drawing and music, and attended regularly the Carnegie Institute's International Art Exhibits, the Phipps

A practical architect, he helped design "Belgrade Terrace," the Spear family home at 5321 Northumberland Street, Squirrel Hill.

Mr. Spear served on the building committee for the Rodef Shalom Temple, Irene Kaufmann Settlement and Montefiore Hospital.

For years he was secretary of the Temple, served as first president of the Settlement and once was president of Montefiore.

He was honorary president of the hospital at the time of his death.

He also was a director of the hospital Service Association (the Blue Cross) here.

Active in philanthropic ventures, Mr. Spear was a trustee of the Y. M. & W. H. A., a member of the National Board of sponsors of the National Jewish Hospital in Denver, and treasurer of its Allegheny County committee. He long was a director of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies.

Surviving, besides his widow, are two sons, Nathaniel, Jr., and Major James N. Spear, New York; a brother Alexander, also of New York; and a grandson, Nathaniel III.

Services were held at the residence, 5321 Northumberland Avenue on Friday, June 20, at 5:00 p. m. Burial private.

Helen A. Stein, a club director of the Red Cross for 44 months in the European Theater, died on June 15, in Walter Reed Hospital, Washington, D. C.

Miss Stein was awarded the Bronze Star while in the Red Cross for services beyond the call of duty.

A life-long resident of Pittsburgh, Miss Stein was a daughter of the late Morris and Bertha Stein. Her home was at 460 Marlin Drive, Mt. Lebanon.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Karl Tobias and Ida Stein, and two brothers, Alfred J. and Dr. I. H. Stein.

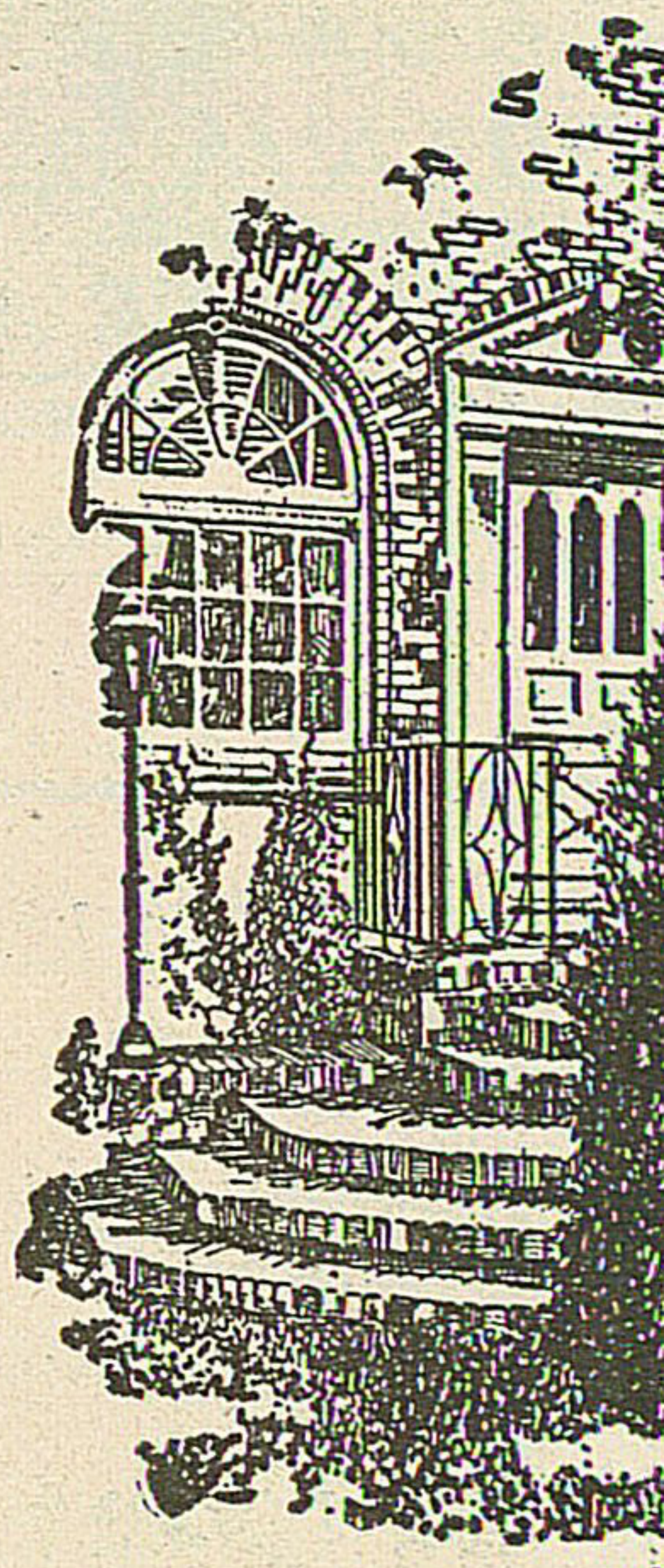
