Traveling to five continents and more than 60 countries since the late 1950s, Donald M. Robinson has used his camera to record the diversity of culture, wildlife, and landscape.

The current exhibition presents Tanzania, Kenya, Ethiopia, and Senegal as captured by Mr. Robinson in the late 1980s and early 1990s. In 1995 his work was featured in a one-man show, *African Odyssey*, at The Carnegie Museum.

Mr. Robinson has been represented in numerous exhibitions in the United States and abroad. His work is included in the permanent collections of the Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art in Loretto, Pennsylvania; The Western Pennsylvania Conservancy; and numerous private collections. He has received national and international awards for his work.
