Considering the large amount of help extended and the wonderful accomplishments, it appears very strange that the Association is overlooked by those who are in a position to further its objects and enlarge the scope of its work. Very few bequests are received and in some cases where almost every other organization was remembered, ours was entirely neglected. It must also be remembered that money donated to our Association forms a permanent charity, in that it is loaned out, repaid and again applied in this manner, thus being kept in continuous circulation.

The present method of conducting the affairs of the Hebrew Free Loan Association by only a few active members of the executive committee, namely, our president, Mr. S. Shupinsky, and our vice presidents, Messrs. L. Frank and Morris Jackson, has thrown too great a burden upon these gentlemen on account of the growth of our activities and it will. be absolutely essential for our directors to take an active part in its management.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF HEBREW FREE LOAN ASSOCIATION.

. The Hebrew Free Loan Association serves a very large clientele among the Jewish people of the City of Pittsburgh and vicinity. Small traders, peddlers, mechanics and workmen often feel the need of a small loan in order to bridge them over a period of distress, and yet they wish to maintain their self respect by not applying to an organization that gives outright charity. There are numerous cases, in this city, of small business men who have received assistance during the early part of their business career, in the form of a loan without interest, from this association.

This, it is believed, is the noblest form of charity and is following out an ancient custom of Israel, that appeals to every Jew.

This is a charity that is very businesslike, for the borrower must bring with him some responsible individual, who will guarantee the repayment of the loan. As is the experience of similar organizations in other cities, so in our work, the percentage of money lost per year is less than two per cent, which is a splendid tribute to the sterling character of the poorer Jews.

Attention is called to the tabulated statement following, from which it will be seen that strictest economy was practiced in maintaining the organization.
