

BETH JACOB SYNAGOGUE TO HOLD AUCTION SALE.

Sunday afternoon, May 2, at 2 o'clock, at the Beth Jacob Synagogue, corner Franklin and Townsend, will be held an auction sale under the auspices of the Hebrew Free Loan Society.

While the Loan Society does not charge interest on any loan, it has found it absolutely necessary to require either a note endorsed by a property holder, or the deposit of jewelry to sufficiently cover the amount loaned.

On none of the pledges which are going to be offered for sale has a payment been made within the last year. In a number of instances registered letters notifying that the pledges would be sold have been returned without the notification that the addressee had moved.

Inasmuch as several hundred dollars are tied up in loans, which are certain of non-payment, the Board of Directors

decided that the best interests of the society demand that these pledges be sold thus releasing a sum of money for the furtherance of the good work being carried on.

It is hoped that there will be a good attendance at this sale and there is no doubt that those who may attend will find themselves repaid in the values which are certain to be offered.
