The Pittsburgh Hebrew School is highly regarded by the members of the community as the pioneer Talmud Torah which for over forty-two years has consistently followed the principles of traditional Judaism in its religious training. Of the two hundred children that comprise the average yearly enrollment, over seventy-five per cent. are unable to pay tuition fees; the others pay but a nominal sum.

The school is located in a district which still comprises a large population of Jews, the majority of whom are compelled to send their children to the free religious schools. Hence, it is obvious that the Talmud Torah must continue to exist to carry on its work among these people, and to do so the Jews of Pittsburgh must contribute towards its support.
