

CAMPAIGN PASSES \$5000,000 MARK
MAY 17 ANNUAL DINNER MEETING WILL FETE CAMPAIGNERS
CROSS SECTION OF GIFTS INDICATE STRONG SUPPORT

In this, the first issue of Campaign News Notes, Dr. William Stark, general co-chairman, and Sam Shear, president, report that the first 82 gifts have brought the Beth Shalom campaign over the \$500,000 mark. The campaign heads also emphasized that this represents less than 10% of the leadership giving. Despite the Passover "lull", Beth Shalom campaigners were able to report steady progress. Campaign division heads -- Irving Schiffman, Meyer Feldman, Benjamin B. Goldman, Simon Pascal (Family Division); Abe Caplan and Ed Glick (Memorials Division); Hyman Moravitz (Leadership Division); Lawrence W. Lasday and Norton Freedel (Young Adult Division) emphasized that many more than the reported gifts were "in the works." Many of the campaign gifts require two and three visits before the family is ready to make its announcement. This Wednesday evening, May 17, the campaign group will discuss future plans at the dinner preceding the Annual Meeting.
