ORTHODOX JEWS TO CONDUCT A BENEVOLENT IN. STITUTION HERE.

Building Is Now Occupied by the Curtis Home for Girls.

Through the efforts of Rev.-A. M. Ashinsky, pastor of the Beth Hamedresh Hagodail congregation in Washington street, and the Beth Jacob congregation in Franklin street, the Orthodox Hebrews of Pittsburg and Western Pennsylvania will soon be enabled to establish a home for the destitute men women of that denomination. Jones property in Breckenridge avenue, known as the Jones "Castle," and now occupied by the Curtis Home for Girls, has been purchased and will be taken over by the Hebrews about March 1.

The purchase price is said to have been \$25,000, and of this sum \$4,000 has already been pledged. Between now and March 1 Mr. Ashinsky will visit all the towns and cities in the western section of the State and endeavor to raise the balance of the money required.

Building Meets Requirements.

The newly acquired property has a frontage of about 60 feet in Breck-enridge avenue, is a three-story brick building, with cupola, of modern architecture, and contains 20 rooms. Altogether the building is well adapted for the purposes of a home, being surrounded by about five acres of ground. That the need for such an institution is a great one is evidenced by the fact that already there are about 20 applicants for admission to it.

The new home will be called Beth Moshab Zkainim, and an association under the same name, which is working in conjunction with Mr. Ashinsky for the raising of funds, will act as a governing body. Already a State charter has been applied for and may be granted at any time. The temporary chairman of the association is L. I. Sablodowsky. E. L. Miller, of 814 Wylie avenue, is secretary, while S. J. Rosenfeld and J. M. Friedman are receiving contributions to defray the expenses of paying for and furnishing the home.

Chapel on Main Floor.

Present plans provide that the home shall have a chapel on the main floor. This will be on the right of the building and will take up the space now occupied by a parlor and small adjoining room. Aside from the converting of these rooms into a chapel and the painting and refurnishing of the building no alterations are contemplated at the present time. The dining room and kitchen will be on the first floor of the building, opposite the chapel, and the upper rooms will be used as bedrooms.

Public-spirited Hebrews have already agreed to furnish the chapel, and promises to supply the furniture

for the rooms have been made by

others. Simon D. Rosenfeld has agreed to furnish the chapel with furniture and books, and Jacob Shapiro has agreed to care for the furnishing of the kitchen and dining room. Mr. and Mrs. Neiman Leibe have promised a scroll for use in the chapel.
