The American Jewish Committee is proud to salute Nicholas D. J. Lane for his record of achievement. He has shown dedication to advancing the interests of the Jewish community and in enhancing the general community's understanding of its positions and concerns.

The causes which have been enriched by his special interest and dedication are many. The plight of Soviet Jews is one of his most pressing priorities, as a Member of the Board of Governors of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry and a Past Chairman of the Pittsburgh Conference on Soviet Jewry.

As a Board Member of the Tri-State Region of the Zionist Organization of America and Presenter of the ZOA Blue White Hotline News Service for the past six years, he has demonstrated his commitment to the people of Israel.

The United Jewish Federation is only one of the many community-oriented organizations benefiting from Nick Lane's diligence. He is now a Board Member of the United Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh, as well as Vice Chairperson of its Community Relations Committee. He also serves as a Co-Chair of the CRC Israel and Middle East Committee.

The American Jewish Committee has long been fortunate to count him among our dedicated leaders. From 1982 to 1985, he served as President of our Pittsburgh Chapter and is now a Life Trustee. He is a founding member of our inter-faith dialogue group. On the national level, Nick served as a member of the AJC Board of Governors from 1985 to 1987 and, at the present time, is a member of the AJC International Affairs Steering Committee.

Not only is Nick Lane personally involved with all of these organizations, but he is also particularly concerned that the public be aware of the causes he supports. For eight years, he was news reporter, interviewer and, finally, anchor for Shalom Pittsburgh on WTAE-TV. He is currently Vice President of the Pittsburgh Jewish Chronicle. He is a familiar figure on the speaking circuit, lecturing to Jewish and non-Jewish groups, and teaching adult education classes on aspects of Jewish history.

An avid book collector, Nick is also a member of the Advisory Board of the Pittsburgh Bibliophiles.

Born in London, England, in 1940, Nick moved to the United States in 1978. He is a graduate of the Highgate School in London and received both a BA and an MA in Modern History from Christ Church, Oxford University. He is a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales. Currently, he is a Vice President of TeleCheck-Pittsburgh and of Banksville, Inc.

Nick and his wife, Eileen, are blessed with two children, Adam and Erica.
