

AGUDATH KEHILLATH

(United Orthodox Congregations)

At a meeting of all Orthodox congregations of Greater Pittsburgh, represented by their presidents and six members, held at the Congregation Poale Zedeck, on December 27th, 1920, for the purpose of organizing a Union of Orthodox Congregations for Pittsburgh and vicinity, it was voted that the original committee and the newly elected officers, together with all the Rabbis of Pittsburgh, shall work out a plan of organization. It was also decided that this body have the privilege of calling in anyone they agree upon to assist them in the cause.

At a caucus meeting held last Tuesday evening at the Congregation Tiphereth Israel, it was agreed upon that the entire body consist of thirty members and that a meeting be called of this committee Monday evening, January 10th, 1921, at 7:30 o'clock,

at the Congregation Shaare Tefillah, 23-25 Miller Street, Pittsburgh.
