Friedel.

The next meeting will take place at the Hebrew Institute, this Sunday afternoon, June 17th, at 2 o'clock, at which time an election of permanent officers for the organization will take place, and the proposed constitution will be presented. All congregations please take notice, and be sure that a representative will attend, as other matters of great importance to Pittsburgh Jewry will also be discussed.
