Congregation and Talmud Torah Agudath Achim Celebrate Seventh Annual Jubilee

In Connection With the Celebration, The Congregation Opens its New Auditorium

The Congregation and Talmud Torah Agudath Achim will celebrate their seventh annual Jubilee on Sunday evening, August 31, in the new auditorium at 2919 Wylie Avenue!

Congregation Agudath Achim was founded in 1923 by a group of prominent men who recognized the urgent need of educating the Jewish youth to the principles of our faith. This group was headed by Rabbi A. M. Ashinsky and was interested mainly in establishing what is now known as the Talmud Torah Agudath Achim.

Beginning with this noble purpose in mind Congregation Agudath Achim has remained a vital factor in the spiritual and educational life of this community, and throughout its seven years of existence has assisted in every worthwhile undertaking of the Jewish community of Pittsburgh.

The congregation has earned the praise of Pittsburgh Jewry for its charitable work in maintaining a number of students at their studies in this institution free of all charge.

At present the facilities and curriculum of the Talmud Torah are being greatly enhanced under the able supervision of the Principal, Samuel Hankin, who is by no means unknown to Pittsburgh Jews, having been one of the pioneers of the Zionist movement in Pittsburgh. Mr. Hankin's prominence in Zionist affairs is only equalled by his qualification as a teacher and his knowledge of pedagogics. In short, Mr. Hankin is a teacher to whom any parents might feel safe in entrusting the education of their child. The Talmud

Torah plans shortly to introduce a class for such young people who did not have the opportunity in their early youth to participate in Jewish instruction.

For the celebration August 31st the publicity committee under the chairmanship of Nathan Katz, assisted by Harry Mosenson, Secretary, H. Lederman, M. Davidson, and A. L. Butler, is now arranging an elaborate program of prominent speakers and musical entertainers.
