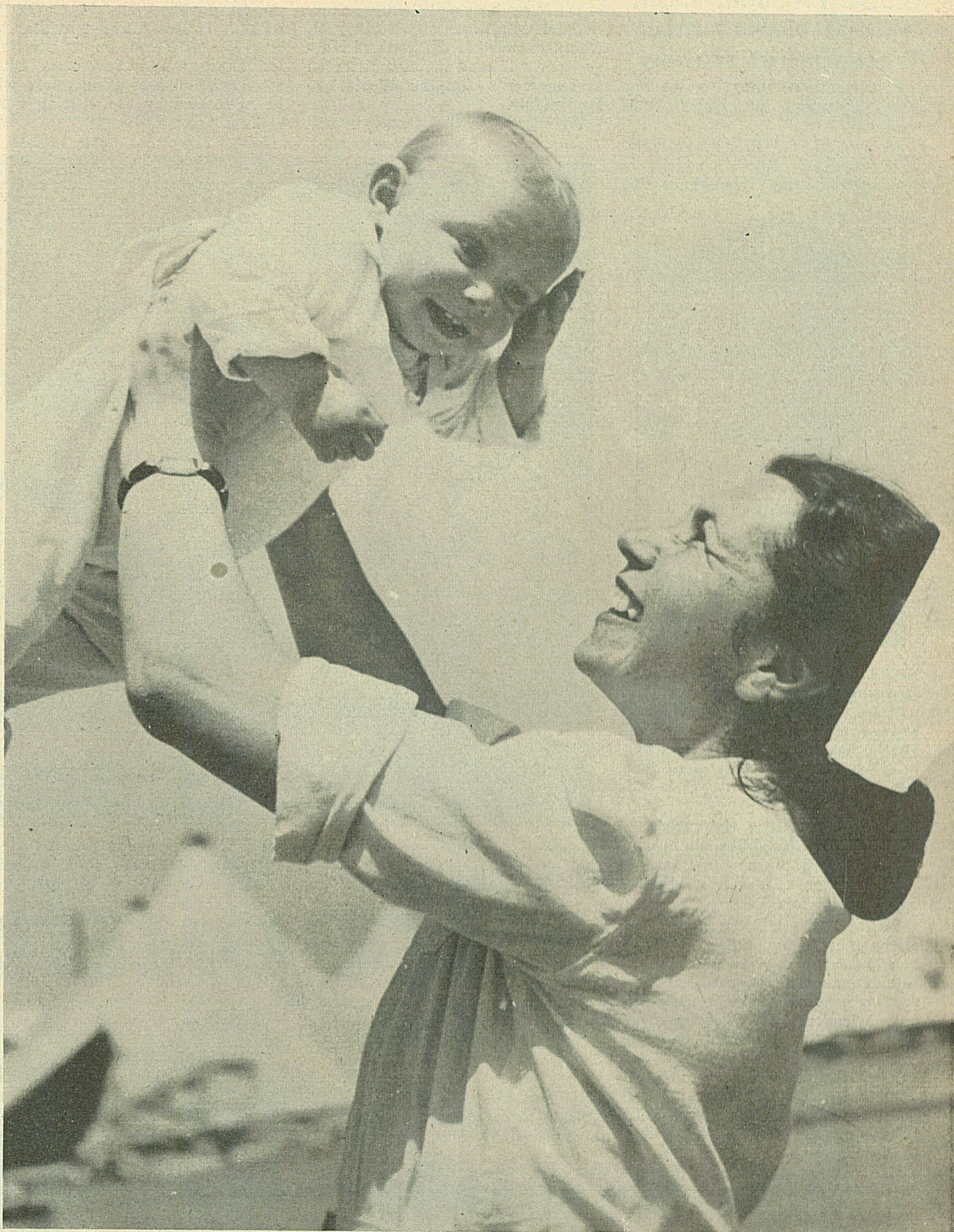

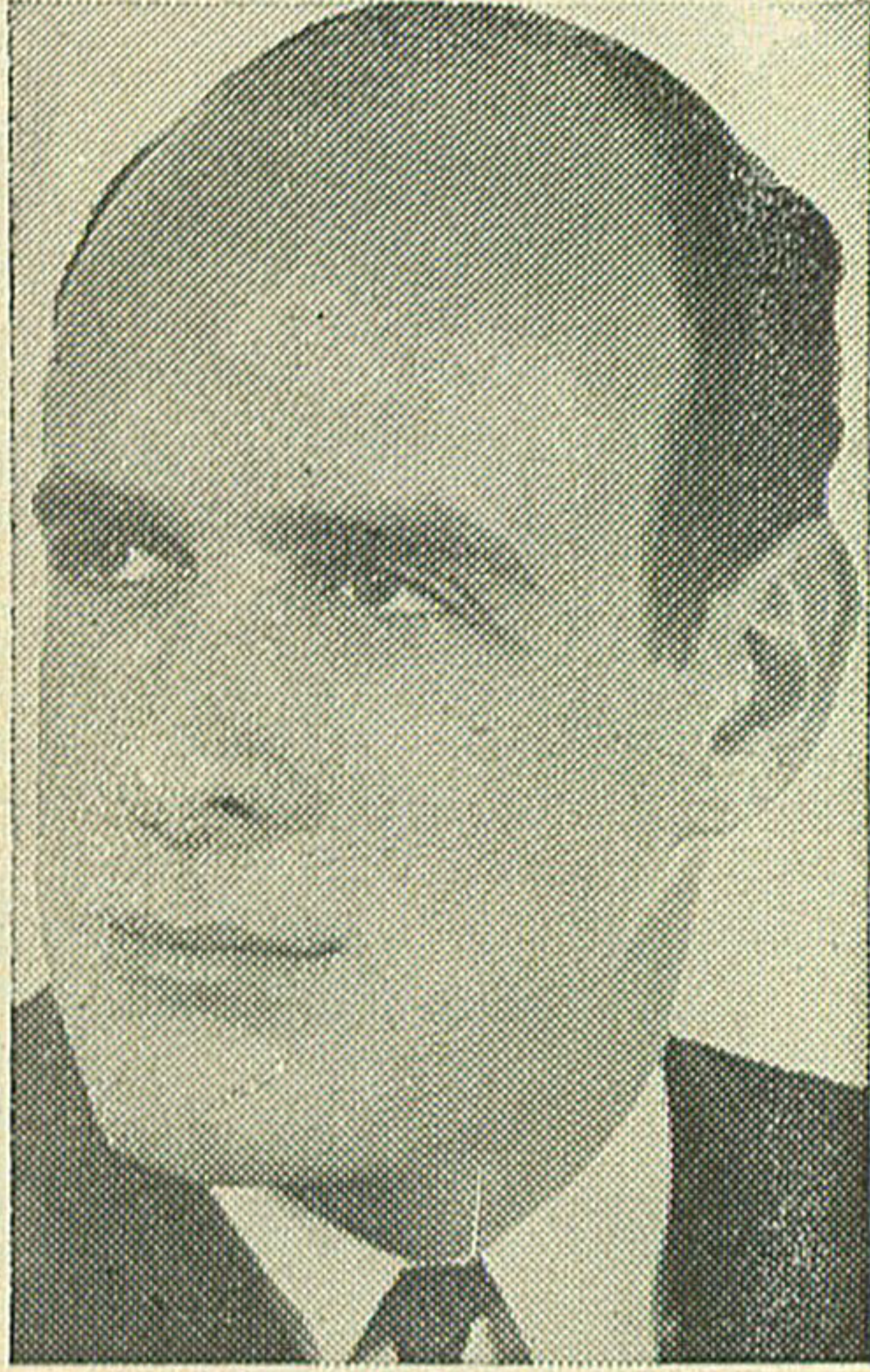

U.J.A. Freedom Train Will be Viewed this Week-End at Station

Pittsburgh will play host to the UJA "Caravan of Hope" this week-end.

A section of the seven-train "Caravan of Hope," which is visiting 150 cities throughout the

country on behalf of the \$250,000,000 national United Jewish Appeal campaign, will be at the Pennsylvania Station this Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Each "caravan" will be a specially painted car, half lounge and half pullman, in which the Israeli soldiers, as well as prominent Israeli officials and American communal leaders will live for three weeks while they barnstorm the country. The lounge section of the car will be devoted to a pictorial exhibit featuring current developments in Israel as well as various phases of the United Jewish Appeal programs in Europe and the United States. A special photographer working on picture story possibilities planned for LIFE and LOOK magazines will be in the Pittsburgh party.

The visiting delegation of celebrities, which includes veterans of the Palestine war, will be feted by local city and state officials, as well as by local United Jewish Fund leaders.

Starting with radio broadcasts and press interview, the Caravan delegation will be honored at a

Caravan Of Hope

America is privileged to see and feel again the great pageant of migration, so familiar in the history of our country. The dramatic symbol of "The Greatest Homecoming In Modern History," the United Jewish Appeal's CARAVAN OF HOPE, is speeding through our land highlighting the new State of Israel's enormous problems in offering haven to the homeless Jews reaching this new nation from all parts of Europe, Asia and Africa. Nearly one hundred cities are being visited by this caravan of seven separate train units. This weekend the Caravan will visit Pittsburgh in behalf of the United Jewish Fund.

Americans have in generous measure helped to nourish the pioneering efforts in Israel. It is good to see evidence of this rejuvenation—it is reminiscent of our early triumphant struggles when we in this country forged a new nation out of the wilderness.

The CARAVAN OF HOPE emphasizes the vigor of the new Israel, but it reminds us that this year 250,000 Jews must be brought out of the wretched DP camps in Europe and other trouble spots of the world, and helped to establish themselves as integral and healthy citizens in their new homeland. Dedicating itself to victory in this job, as vital as the success in war, Israel will win again—aided by the monumental United Jewish Appeal campaign in America, and the United Jewish Fund drive in Pittsburgh.

It is apropos that the Caravan should be in Pittsburgh this Sunday, the day that the Montefiore Hospital breaks ground for its new and desperately needed building program.

For the Caravan and Hospital symbolize the 1949 United Jewish Fund drive of "Historic Opportunity." Truly, we are one community—we are one people—we have a common obligation.
