
Dr. Kessler Named To Education Post

Dr. Aharon Kessler, Director of Community Services and Consultations for the American Association for Jewish Education since 1946, was named this week as Executive Director of the recently organized Pittsburgh Council on Jewish Edu-

cation. The announcement was made by Judge Benjamin Lencher, president of the local educational group.

The appointment of Dr. Kessler to this important post follows the October action of the United Jewish Fund Board which voted a budget for the Council on Jewish Education.

With the assumption of duties by the Executive Director, the Council on Jewish Education — with the support of the United Jewish Fund and the cooperation of the community groups concerned with Jewish Education—is in a position to implement the basic recommendations of the Self Study on Jewish Education.

Since 1946, Dr. Kessler, as Director of Community Services for the American Association, has traveled extensively throughout the country to conduct surveys, assist communities in organizing central educational agencies, interpret Jewish educational needs to federations and welfare funds and conduct workshops for teaching personnel.

In 1947, he represented the

American Association at the first World Conference on Jewish Education in Jerusalem, and spent two months studying the Israeli educational system in large cities and settlements.

In 1950, at the invitation of the

Jewish Agency for Palestine Dr. Kessler conducted studies in Brazil, Uruguay, Argentina, Chile and Peru.

Dr. Kessler has been in the field of Jewish education since 1925. He served as teacher and principal of a number of afternoon Hebrew schools, and educational and executive director of several synagogue centers. From 1941 to 1946,

he was national executive director

of Young Judea and a member of

the American Zionist Youth Commission.

Dr. Kessler holds a Ph. D. in rabbinic literature, Bible and Jewish history from Dropsie College.
