## Bickur Cholim Home Dedication To Open Campaign



NEW BICKUR CHOLIM CONVALESCENT HOME will be dedicated Sunday, September 15. The new Bickur Cholim Convalescent Home, located at 208 South Negley, will be dedicated September 15 at 2 p.m. Herman Fineberg will serve as chairman of the dedication. The new Home will double the present bed capacity of the Bickur Cholim Home.

A total of \$15,000 has been borrowed by the Bickur Cholim Society to make possible the renovations of the new Convalescent Home, located at 208 South Negley Avenue, which will be dedicated on Sunday, September 15, at 2 p.m.

The dedication will be coupled with the initiation of the Bickur Cholim capital fund campaign for \$40,000, to be headed by Samuel

Goldstock.

The capital fund campaign will enable the Bickur Cholim Convalescent Home to bring its bed capacity to 32, doubling its present capacity, and will make possible complete remodeling, purchase of medical equipment, and modern fire-proofing.

Herman Fineberg will serve as chairman for the September 15th dedication ceremonies, and will host an important breakfast meet-

ing that Sunday morning.

Heretofore, the major funds for the establishment of the Home came from the Bickur Cholim Society, Daughters of the Bickur Cholim, Bickur Cholim Juniors, and the affiliated Men's Clubs.

Two years ago, the Bickur Cholim Convalescent Home conducted its first city-wide campaign for maintenance, and last year raised \$19,000 in its second community effort, for maintenance.

The \$40,000 drive now being undertaken, will provide both capital needs and maintenance needs.

Mrs. Hyman Zeidenstein, president of the Bickur Cholim Society, has emphasized that the new Home will be conducted in keeping with the traditions of Bickur Cholim, which is serving the needy sick, and making available the Bickur Cholim resources to all members of the community, with no regard to the patient's ability to pay.

Committees for the September 15 breakfast, which is to be chaired by Mr. Fineberg, as well as other campaign groups, are now being

organized.
