Bickur Cholim Convalescent Home will hold its seventh annual dinner-dance and show at the Hotel Webster Hall on Sun., Nov. 12, at 6 p.m.

The event will feature an internationally known Hollywood and Broadway entertainer and dancing to the music of Archie Tarshis and his orchestra. The affair will inaugurate the kick-off for the erection of a new building adjacent to the present structure.

The annual dinner-dance and show and the Building Expansion Fund Drive are both under the general chairmanship of David E. Taub, assisted by the following co-chairmen: Mrs. Wm. Americus, Mrs. I. Bickur Cholim is a non-profit organization caring for the sick and needy. The present 22-bed capacity is completely filled, and the continuous flow of applications from those unfortunate ones, unable to care for themselves, prompted the Board of Governors to expand its facilities by the erection of a three story addition to the property adjacent to the present building.

It is expected that ground breaking ceremonies will take place early in the Spring of 1962.

PCC Sends Sp... On Israel-Ar...

UNITED NATIONS (JTA) — Dr. Johnson was appointed as special envoy of the United Nations and has left for Israel and the Arab states to explore the progress made in solving the refugee problem. He will remain in the Middle East during which he will confer with the heads of governments on the tangled refugee issue.

Dr. Johnson, who is president of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, met several times with the members of the Palestine Conciliation Commission here. He also conferred separately with Ambassador Michael S. Comay, head of the Israel delegation to the United Nations, and with the heads of the delegations of the Arab states. His talks with the diplomats took place during two separate luncheons given by Francis T. P. Plimpton, deputy U. S. permanent representative at the United Nations. The Palestine Conciliation Commission is composed of representatives of the United States, France and Turkey.

Dr. Johnson's first stop was in London, where he finalized his Middle East itinerary. From there he is to proceed to Beirut, capital of Lebanon, where the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees has its headquarters. UNRWA is the body in charge of the United Nations relief program for the refugees. During his stay in Beirut, Dr. Johnson will also confer with the Lebanese Government on the refugee issue.
