OPPOSE CENSUS OF JEWS.

Berlin, October 12.—Much indignation has been aroused in Germany by the motion of the general committee of the Reichstag calling for a census of men serving in the various associations charged with providing the necessities of life for the nation and known as the Kriegsgesellschaften.

In the "Vorwärts," Philip Scheidemann, socialist leader in the Reichstag, calls it a monstrous offense against all good manners and traditions, and even more so against the foundation of the non-confessional constitution.

The "Tagblatt" remarks that if it is thought necessary to count Jews, not only those in peace callings, but also those serving voluntarily in the trenches, should be counted.

The progressive people's party, which is responsible for the measure, wishes it understood, however, that a census is necessary in order to counteract the general belief that the associations in question have afforded a subterfuge to a great many Jewish shirkers.
