



Rabbi Morris Feldman to Direct Local Hillel Foundation

The appointment of Rabbi Morris Feldman as Director of the newly established B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation of greater Pittsburgh was announced this week by Rabbi Arthur Lelyveld National Director, and Herman Fineberg of Pittsburgh a member of the National Commission of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations.

The B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations sponsor religious and cultural activities for Jewish students at

more than 200 colleges and universities. The Pittsburgh Foundation will serve the Jewish students at the University of Pittsburgh, Carnegie Institute of Technology, Duquesne University, and the Pennsylvania College for Women. Through the cooperation of the Board of Directors of the Young Men's and Women's Hebrew Association the facilities of the "Y" have been made available to the participants in the Hillel program.

The establishment of the Foundation was made possible largely through the efforts and support of the women of B'nai B'rith District Grand Lodge No. 3.

Rabbi Feldman, a graduate of the Mesifita Theological Seminary of Brooklyn and the City of New York, received a Master's degree from the School of Social Work of the University of Pittsburgh.

Mrs. Irvin Taitz, President of the Women's Council of Greater Pittsburgh and Morris Kushner, President of the Pittsburgh Council of B'nai B'rith in a joint statement said, "We are happy to welcome

Rabbi Feldman to Pittsburgh. We know that the newly established Foundation will be a credit to B'nai B'rith, the largest and oldest Jewish service organization in America."
