## THE TRUTH IS

Anyone can be exposed and develop the disease: men, women, and children.

### You can get AIDS ONLY from:

- Unprotected sex
- Contaminated needles
- Infected mother to a fetus during pregnancy, childbirth or breast feeding
- Tainted blood (rare)

### You CANNOT get AIDS from:

- Hugging
- Kissing
- Eating off the same dishes
- Sharing the same bathroom, telephone, computer, clothes, water fountain, swimming pool
- Sweat
- Tears
- Saliva

Because their immune systems are weak, people with AIDS are more in danger of catching something from you than you are of catching something from them!

- are invited to get together to provide strength and hope to each other.

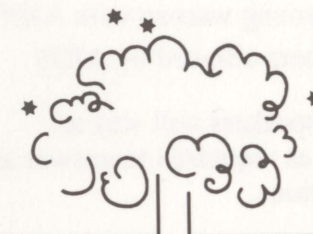
