The ~~first~~ meeting of the Tree of Life Sisterhood was held in the Tree of Life Synagogue March 15, 1943, presided over by Mrs. W. Marx, the newly-elected president.

It was decided to give Rabbi Newberger and his family a personal Purim gift which was to be chosen by Mrs. W. Marx and Mrs. A. Lang.

Names of the people to whom letters were written were then read. A message from the Salkin family donating \$15 and a donation of \$3 from Mrs. Molly Salkin in memory of their mother was reported.

The treasury report was given. The preceding staff left a balance of \$119.06 in the treasury. The balance on March 15, 1943 was \$142.87 including the proceeds from the Bingo Party.

An announcement of a Picture Play given by the children in Shul son Sun., March 21, was made.

There was a discussion on the subject of the laundering of the table linens. It was decided that the chairmen of each dinner committee send the soiled linens to the laundry and that the bill would be paid by the organization sponsoring the dinner.

Before the meeting was adjourned, an announcement of the next meeting was made. The date set was June 1st.

A Sisterhood meeting was held in the Synagogue, June 7, presided over by the president Mrs. W. Marx. The minutes were read and approved.

The treasurer, Mrs. S. Rosen, reported that \$197.86, including ~~968~~ profit from the B'nai B'rith dinner, was in the treasury.

Following this report, a discussion concerning the cleaning and painting of the Shul was held. It was decided that the Sisterhood should try to undertake the placing of flower vases, cleaning the chandelier, and replacing of bulbs. Mrs. S. Brady was appointed to shop for the vases.

Mrs. W. Marx volunteered to sew new curtains for the school room, and Mrs. A. Slesnick and Mrs. J. Broida were appointed to buy the material. Approximately \$25 was allotted for this project.

Mrs. S. Rosen was then appointed to see that the walls were cleaned

and Mrs. W. Mart offered to shop for linoleum seaming.

The Rabbi sent a message of 'thanks' to the Sisterhood for treating the children on June 6. He also suggested that the mothers should alternate in the treating and serving of the children in order to create more interest among the adults towards Sunday school.

Some social event, such as a lawn fete, was suggested for later in the season but no definite plans were made.

Before the meeting was adjourned, the president stated that announcements of the next meeting would be mailed.
