

# HADASSAH TAKES OVER FOOD SERVICE AT THE Y

The Y is happy to announce that arrangements have been completed with Pittsburgh Chapter of Hadassah to operate a Tea Room and take charge of all food service in the building. Hadassah will convert the present snack bar into a tea room where a complete menu of sandwiches, salads, pastries, ice cream and beverages of all kinds will be available every day except Saturdays and Jewish holidays.

Arrangement also has been reached with Hadassah to have the sole responsibility of providing food service for the various organizations meeting at the Y. Dessert luncheons, small parties and refreshments at meetings may be arranged through Mrs. Theodore Lencher, Catering Chairman, 5720 Munhall Road, HA. 1-4009. As in the past, or-

ganizations will not be permitted to bring in food or refreshments of any kind, and have been advised to this effect by Herman Passamaneck, Executive Director.

Negotiations for taking over the food service in the Y building by Hadassah were completed recently after several conferences between representatives of that group and the Y Restaurant Committee, of which Joseph H. Rossen is the Chairman. According to present plans the Tea Room will be dedicated and opened for service on April 8, the day after Passover. Organizations desiring service at meetings before that date should apply to Mrs. Lenchner.

The present facilities will be re-furnished and re-decorated and a completely new atmosphere will prevail. Members of the Y and their friends are invited to watch for the opening date.
