Wilkinsburg Group Inaugurates Sunday School

On Sunday morning, March 1, at 10:00 o'clock, the first meeting of the newly formed religious school for Jewish children was held in the Assembly Hall (formerly Spartan Club), 710 Penn Avenue, Wilkinsburg. This resulted from an idea of Alexander Reich who had urged Mrs. Sigmund Arnold this winter to make a survey of the Jewish families in the borough.

The survey showed nearly one hundred Jewish families residing in Wilkinsburg. As a result of interviews with all these families, it was conceived advisable to start a Sunday School for the children under the di-

rection of the Council of Jewish Women and the initial enrollment of twenty-five is expected to be doubled next Sunday. All children between the ages of four and eighteen are welcome.

To aid the project, the mothers agreed to form a Mother's Club under the name of Jewish Women's Club of Wilkinsburg, and held their first meeting at the home of Mrs. Sigmund Arnold.
