Mishcan Israel Whereas we the undersigned citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania whose names are subscribed to this charter or certificate of incorporation have associated ourselves together for the purpose and upon the terms and by the name herein stated under the provisions of an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania entitled an Act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations approved the twenty ninth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy four and the several supplements thereto we do therefore set forth and declare that:

1. The name of the corporation is the "Mishcan Israel" (The Dwelling of Israel).
2. The purposes for which this corporation is formed are to exercise religious worship according to the doctrines, discipline and uses of the Hebrew Church.
3. The business of the corporation is to be transacted in the City of Pittsburgh.

4. The Corporation shall have perpetual successions by its corporal name.
