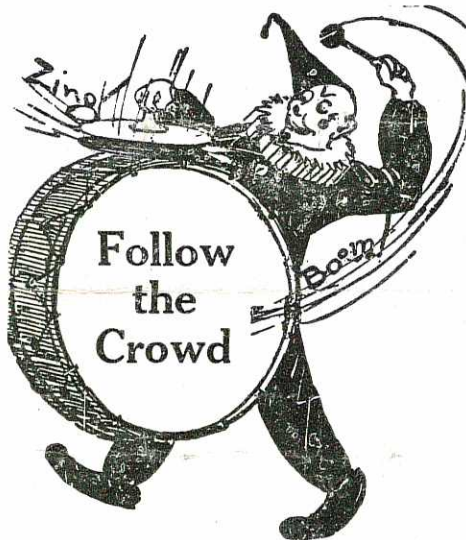
ALL KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS!
