

# Pittsburgh to Have Kosher Restaurant

The Rabbinical Council of Pittsburgh announced yesterday that beginning with the Passover season, Wednesday, March 28, the F. & F. restaurant and delicatessen, located at 2113 Murray Avenue, will operate as a strictly kosher restaurant. The owners, Paul Freuthal and Henry Feld, have agreed to make all the necessary arrangements in accordance with the requirements laid down by the Rabbinical Council. A permanent representative of the Council, a Mashgiach or kashruth supervisor, will be employed.

The establishment will be closed on Sabbaths and holidays. All meats and other foods, whether sold over the counters or at the tables, will be kosher. Milk and meat products will not be served together.

A spokesman for the Council expressed great satisfaction at the arrangement and pointed out that such a restaurant together with a catering service would be of importance in connection with Bar Mitzvahs, weddings, public gatherings, and other occasions.

Working with the Rabbinical Council is a committee of laymen consisting of A. Dunn, Max Engelberg, Attorney J. D. Golding, Dr. Jack Goldman, Leon Gottlieb, Dr. Asher Isaacs, and J. Siegel.
