

In re Petition of Beth Zedek,
Congregation for a Charter of
Incorporation

In the Court of Common Pleas,
No. 1, of Allegheny County Penna.
No. 150 September Term 1907.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the said Court:

In compliance with the requirements of an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania entitled "An Act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations," approved the 29 day of April A.D. 1874, and the supplements thereto, the undersigned, all of whom are citizens of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together for the purpose of the support of public worship and desiring that they may be incorporated according to law, do hereby certify.

1. The name of the proposed corporation is the, Beth Zedek Congregation
2. That said corporation is formed for the purpose of the support of public worship according to the faith, doctrine, discipline and usages of the Orthodox Hebrew Church.
3. The business of said corporation is to be transacted in the City of Pittsburgh, County of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania
4. The said corporation is to exist perpetually.
5. The Board of Directors of said corporation is fixed at ten, the majority of whom shall be lay members, and the names and residences of those who are chosen directors for the first year are

6. The yearly income of the corporation other than that derived from real estate shall not exceed the sum of \$5000.00.

7. Any property real or personal, which shall hereafter be bequeathed, devised or conveyed to said corporation shall be taken and held or encumbered to it, subject to the control and disposition of the lay members thereof or such constituted officers or representatives thereof as shall be composed of a majority of lay members.

And now, to wit, this 19th day of July 1902 the within certificate of incorporation having been on file in the office of the Prothonotary of said court since the 21st day of June 1902 the day on which publication of notice of intended application was first made as appears from entry thereon, and due proof of publication having been thereunto presented to me, I do hereby certify that I have perused and examined said instrument and find the same to be in proper form and within the purposes named in the first class of corporations specified in section 2 of the Act of April 29th 1874 and its supplements, and the said purposes are lawful and not injurious to the community.

It is therefore ordered and decreed that the said charter be approved, and is hereby approved, and upon the recording of the said charter and its endorsements and this order in the office of the Recorder of Deeds in and for said county, which is now hereby ordered, the subscribers thereto, and their associates shall therewith be a corporation.

In re amendment

of
Charter of Spicktown Beneficial Society.

In the Court of Common
Pleas No. 1 of Allegheny County

To the Honorable the Judges of said Court:

The Spicktown Beneficial Society, petitioner hereby certifies under its corporate seal that it is a corporation created and existing under the provisions of the Act of General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations" approved the 29th day of April A. D. 1874, and its supplements, as is shown by its charter dated the day of February 1883, a true and correct copy of which is herewith submitted; and that it is included in the class of corporation referred to in Section 42 of said recited act of 1874 and its supplements, that in pursuance of corporate action duly had it is desirous of improving, amending or altering the articles and conditions of its said charter in accordance with provisions of said Act in the following particulars that is to say,

Section 7nd. which reads as follows: "II. The purposes for which it is formed are to advance the social welfare of its members, to provide a fund to support its members in case of accidents happening to them while in good standing in the society, to provide a fund to be disbursed to the deceased members families and to bury such members who die leaving no family," shall be amended to read as follows: I The purposes for which it is formed are to advance the social welfare of its members, to provide a fund to aid and support its members in case of accidents or sickness happening to them while in good standing in the society, to provide a fund to be disbursed to the deceased members families and to bury such members who die leaving no family.

Wherefore the Spicktown Beneficial Society prays that the said amendments may be approved, and that in compliance of the provisions of said act be deemed and taken to be a part of this
